#### New meets old

As Hemil says, "Delicate porcelain tiles, beautiful marble slab countertops and brushed chrome tubs are some of the materials utilised in the soft industrial style. Another aspect that distinguishes this style from others is the open concept design that features walk-in showers that help create a greater feeling of space, while lending a rustic feel to a contemporary futuristic bathroom space."

## Tile it up

If you don't want too many wooden fixtures in your bathroom, another method is to use small tiles in white or black, or a mixture of both. A minimalistic all-white ensemble brightens up the area, and the usage of copper accessories adds extra glamour to the look. The tiles reflect light creating a sense of space. Added natural light from large windows is a plus.
